### The Spirit's Encouragement

# I. God's gift of salvation and redeemed relationship with Himself (Gospel) is wonderful, but also profoundly humbling. The good news of Christmas (gospel) implies some bad news, too.

- A. At Christmas and New Year we rejoice in God's grace.
- B. But the grace of God in Christ implies our own humiliating failure: we desperately need grace because we have so much wrong with us.

## II. Rom. 8. A description of life in the Spirit: A supreme gift and a sobering reminder.

- A. The Principle of the Spirit sets us free from condemnation. 1-2
  - 1. Which means that condemnation is the normal state for humanity. John 3:16-19 (Rom.5:10)
  - 2. But it's gone for those in Christ Jesus.
- B. The Power of the Spirit releases us to obey. 5-11
  - 1. Which means that obeying the Lord from the inside out is counterintuitive to fallen humanity. (Rom.3:23)
- C. The Adoption of the Spirit makes us children of God. 12-17
  - 1. Which means that orphanhood is the natural condition of humanity. We are not naturally born children of God. (John 1:12-13)
  - 2. Only those thus adopted are children of God. (Jn. 1:12-13)
  - 3. Only the children inherit. Heirs with Christ.
- D. The Hope of the Spirit keeps us focused on the Future. 18-25
  - 1. Which means that true hope cannot be found in this age. Gal.1:4
  - 2. Waiting With perseverance/patience.

#### III. The Action of the Spirit insures God's purposes for us. 3 ways. 8:26-30

- A. He translates our prayers perfectly. 26-27
  - 1. Which means we are basically weak and ignorant about what to pray for.
  - 2. We never need to wonder if prayers are "getting through"
  - 3. He gives us what we would have asked for if we knew what He knows.
  - 4. Note the difference between confidence in God, and confidence in God doing what we think he should do. One is faith, the other is pride and presumption.
- B. He guides our circumstances meticulously. 28
  - 1. Which means that very hard things will happen to us (Jn.16:33) and we cannot control everything. The context is "suffering in this age" 8:18
  - 2. All things work: all the details of our lives.
    - a) Specifically, the suffering things that lead to glory. (8:18-25)
  - 3. Those who love God and are called
    - a) Love God and Called = Christians
    - b) Called = summoned, not just invited in the generic sense.
  - 4. According to His purpose "advanced planning"
    - a) prothesis = purpose, advanced planning, preplanned purpose in God's mind. Eph. 1:11
  - 5. Not that "everything will feel better here and now"
  - 6. Not that we will understand why things happen here and now.
  - 7. Not that God creates the evil people do. Acts 2:23
  - 8. It does mean that God uses every detail of our lives in the suffering and fallen world for His kingdom and for our growth.

#### C. He guarantees our destiny permanently: 29-30

- 1. Which means we cannot guarantee it ourselves!
- 2. Conformed to the image of His Son.
  - a) This is the "good" we are destined for.
  - b) A reference to our internal transformation (already) and physical resurrection (not yet). Phil. 3:21
- 3. By the exercise of His Grace: (these are all pasted tense, emphasizing certainty)
  - a) Foreknown. To deliberately and intimately know a person.
  - b) Predestined. To decide something before it happens (Eph 1:4,5,11)
  - c) Called. More than a generic call. Actually, a summons.
  - d) Justified. Declared righteous by faith.
  - e) Glorified: Resurrection
- **4.** This means that all the people in the first group are in the second group—like a tour group that doesn't lose people. (Jn.6:37-40; 10:27-30)

#### IV. How should a Christian respond to this? Admit weakness and live confidently:

- A. Vent by talking to Him honestly. Lk.18:1-8
  - 1. Take it to Him in frustration, letting Him move
  - 2. Honesty and persistence, coupled with humility and awareness that you might be wrong...
  - 3. God has made a covenant in Christ to hear our prayers
- B. Worship by trusting Him practically. 2 Cor.4:16-18
  - 1. Especially in trauma. Worship is a lifestyle of loyalty and trust. (Rom.12)
    - a) It is at the point of trauma and confusion that faith happens.
- C. Rest by focusing on Him eternally. Col.3:1-4
  - 1. If you are a Christian, you are secure. But if your mind is anchored only in this age, you will be restless.

#### V. How should a Pre-Christian respond to this?

- A. By realizing that we are not what we pretend to be—autonomous and self-sufficient.
- B. Let God draw you into his humility and grace. Come to Christ.
