The Obedience of Faith: Baptism August 18, 2019 19063-A Matt.3:13-17; Rom.15:18; 1:5; Matt.28:18-20

I. How does the "obedience of faith" show? Christian Baptism. Jesus identified with us.

- A. Greek word Baptidzo means to immerse, dunk. Used of dving cloth.
 - 1. It is always done by somebody else—somebody representing the Christian community.
 - 2. It is always done to somebody who has expressed a knowledgeable, credible and genuine faith in Christ.
- B. It is the first act of obedience of faith in the Christian life.
 - 1. The "obedience of faith" included the entire package of repentant faith and water baptism.

C. It is significant = a sign

- 1. It is a material sign of an invisible reality. Like Communion
- 2. The sacraments/ordinances are material portals that connect us with the Spirit realities of God. These are symbolic, but they are more than symbolic as well.
- 3. The spirit realm does affect the material realm and your body and spirit are intimately connected. What has happened in your spirit (regeneration) needs a material expression in your body.
- 4. Salvation is physical—your current body will be resurrected in Christ and so you should put it in the water now.

II. What Baptism Signifies. Matt. 28:19-20; Rom.6:1-5; Col.2:6-14; 1 Pet.3:18-22.

A. It signifies materially the Spiritual experience of salvation in Christ.

- 1. Cleansing from sin. Col.2:6-14
 - a) You were washed, cleansed,
- 2. Union with Christ. Eph.1:1-10
 - a) You are a new kind of human, metaphysically joined to God in Christ.
 - b) "In Christ" language is used over 200 times in the NT
- 3. Regeneration by the Spirit.1 Cor.12:12-13; 6:14-20
 - a) Your body immersed in the Spirit and joined to God.
- 4. Immersion in the life of the Trinity. John 17:20-23
 - a) Drawn into the Trinitarian life.!!

B. It signifies the beginning of faith and discipleship. Acts.2:38; 8:36; 16:33; 22:16;

1. This is why it is done as soon as possible upon a profession of faith.

III. What are you saying when you get baptized? Matt. 28:18-20

- A. Jesus Christ is the Risen and Saving Lord. Rom.10:9-10
 - 1. He is God in the flesh who died for my sins came back from the dead. (Rom 10:9-10)
 - 2. He is the current ruler of the universe and will be the physical ruler of the earth.

B. I have repented and declared loyalty to Him. Mk.1:15; Lk.24:47

- 1. I have repented of my evil.
 - a) and given my body, soul, and spirit to Him.

C. I am trusting Him alone for my forgiveness and eternal life. Rom.3:28

- 1. I have repented of my goodness.
- 2. I don't rely on my ability to be good, but on Christ's ability and sacrifice on my behalf.
- D. I am His disciple now and forever. Matt.11:25-30
 - 1. His words and ways are what I am about.

IV. What is the Lord saying when you get baptized?

- A. I have always known you. Eph.1:1-10
 - 1. Chosen in Christ since before the world??
- B. I have joined you to Myself in Christ materially, spiritually and eternally. Col.2
 - 1. You have died already and will be raised up eternally. Col.3:1-4
- C. I have forgiven you sins, all of them. Col.2
 - 1. Washed and clean forever
- D. I have regenerated you by my Spirit. 1 Cor.12:12-13; Titus 3:4-7
 - 1. You are empowered by My Spirit to live for me in this world. Rom.6
- E. <u>I have begun a transformation in you that will result in your resurrection</u>. Phil.1:6; Rom.12:1-2.
