Genesis Chapter 1 Gen.1:1-2:3; Jn.1:1-5; Col.1:15-20 14062-B August 13, 2014

I. The Bible starts its account at the beginning. John 1:1-5; Colossians 1:15-20; Gen.1:1-2

- A. Remember the purpose of Genesis: To reveal the creation, fall, and redemption themes.
 - 1. Not to answer all questions of physics, history, chronology.
 - a) There are unanswered questions, loose ends, but they do not contribute to the story.
 - 2. Not to satisfy skepticism.
 - a) Radical skepticism is self-defeating and a form of idolatry.

II. Genesis 1:1-2:3

- A. God brought everything into existence from nothing. 1-2
 - 1. Not from pre-existing matter.
 - 2. Not as an emanation of himself. (Pantheism/Panentheism)
 - 3. Note the Trinitarian echoes.
 - a) Father, Son, Spirit all involved here according to the whole Bible.
- B. God made it all orderly and purposeful and very good. 3-31
 - 1. Day 1. Light/Energy: 3-5
 - 2. Day 2. Water above and below. 6-8
 - 3. Day 3. Land/Sea/ Plant life with reproduction. 9-13
 - 4. Day 4. Receptacles for the light: 14-19
 - a) Sun, moon, stars, the timepiece of the universe
 - 5. Day 5. Creatures for water and sky. 20-23
 - a) Dinosaurs? V.21"Giant sea creatures." tannin gedolim. Tannin = serpent/reptile. (Gerald Schroeder, *Science of God*, p.201)
 - 6. Day 6. Creatures for the land and humanity. 24-31.
 - a) Let us make man in our image. Interesting plural. 26
- C. God finished it. Rested on the 7th day. 2:1-3
 - 1. Day 7. The Lord's Personal Day.
 - a) Sabbath. He tells us to rest one day, too. To be reminded that our work, while not done, rests in His work which is done. A deed of faith to rest.
 - 2. Completion, not a cyclical history.
 - 3. A new Rest began in Christ, pointing to the next age. Heb.4

III. Pastoral advice on navigating Genesis 1-2 in our era. Three things to think:

- A. All Truth is God's Truth. *It's our interpretations of it that divide us.*
 - 1. If God created the material world and says it reveals things (general revelation Ps.19; Rom.1:18-20) and if he also gave his Word to us (special revelation), then the knowledge we gain from each, *if interpreted correctly,* will mesh together.
 - 2. In other words, there is no real war between science and the Bible. If you're creating one you don't have a biblical worldview.
 - 3. Our problems are with the *interpretation* of what we see through science and what we read in the Bible. (Carson, *The God Who Is There* chapter 1)
 - a) Science has more disagreement about origins than some folks think.
 - (1) It describes mechanisms without explaining causes.
 - b) Theology has more disagreement about interpretation of Genesis than some folks think.
 - (1) Clear back to Augustine there was question about how to interpret Gen.1

- B. All Christians agree that God created. *They just disagree on how.* 2 basic ways to blend natural and special revelation:
 - 1. A quick creation: Creation in six "normal" 24 hour days and a young earth.
 - a) This implies creation with the appearance of age, miraculously accelerating the process.
 - b) There is nothing intrinsically impossible about this if there is a God who creates out of nothing.
 - 2. <u>A long creation</u>: Creation through time commensurate with Big Bang cosmology and current scientific interpretation of the evidence. Two broad types of interpretation here.
 - a) The Biblical text leaves room for day-ages in which God created in stages. (Gap Theory, Day-Age Theory, Theistic Evolution)
 - b) The Biblical text is a literary device designed to address the fact of creation without addressing how long it took.
 - (1) The Framework Theory and others. Non-Chronological, poetic, etc.

C. The gospel is the grid.

- 1. The best course for spiritual growth in Christ is to look at the minimum reality necessary to make sense of the rest of the Bible and the gospel.
- 2. The length of time it took to create has no bearing on the gospel.

IV. Four Crucial Realities you must know to grow in Christ.

- A. God is there and he alone is eternal. The existence of God is the presupposition that makes sense of life. And it is a Presupposition. The only one that works. Heb.11:6
 - 1. The one big cosmic question. Why is there anything at all, instead of nothing?
 - a) If anything at all exists, something must have always existed.
 - b) That Something is either personal or impersonal. Mind or Stuff.
 - c) It makes more sense that Mind created Stuff than that Stuff created Mind.
 - 2. 4 big human questions. Ravi Zacharias'
 - a) Origins: Personal and specific Creation
 - (1) You are more valuable than many sparrows. Matt. 10:29-31
 - (2) Naturalism says we are complete accidents, including our ability to think, beauty, love, relationship, etc.
 - b) Meaning: Knowing, loving and glorifying God.
 - (1) Jesus summed up the entire Law with the Shema and Lev.19:18 (Mk.12:29-31).
 - (2) Naturalism says there is meaning, but it's hard to see where it comes from if we are just accidents in a universe that will die.
 - c) Morality: God's character revealed in His Word/Law.
 - (1) The fruit of the Spirit.
 - (a) Love, Joy, Peace (Gal.5:22ff)
 - (2) The expression of God's Word/law.
 - (a) Moral, ethical, spiritual justice, goodness, righteousness in community.
 - (b) What makes the Law dangerous to us is not that it requires justice and goodness in community, but that we cannot maintain these things and thus fall under its curse.
 - (3) Naturalism says there is morality, but it has been hijacked from the gospel and/or the Bible. This is Intellectual Property Theft.
 - d) <u>Destiny: The fulfillment of all of these forever. Ultimate Rest...</u>
 - (1) A re-created universe without evil and with the fulfillment of all the above.
 - (2) Naturalism says that we will cease to exist and so will the universe, for no reason.

- B. There is only one God and he is a Person. He did all these thing ...
 - 1. <u>Monotheism: The main issue for the original hearers</u>
 - a) Not how long it took God to create, but the fact that there is only one God and he did create everything.
 - b) Polytheism/henotheism
 - (1) Plato, Aristotle, Plotinus, Stoicism, Epicureanism.
 - c) Monism/Pantheism/Panentheism is not true.
 - (1) Monism. This is the primary view behind most New Age metaphysics.
 - 2. Personal Ultimate. A main message for our world. Ultimate reality is a Person, not molecules.
 - a) Knowledge of Reality is Relational.
 - (1) All matter is sourced in the Spirit, the Mind of God. Which means that physical matter, including the "laws of physics," is the material extension of a personal and expressed will for life—God's spoken, expressed desire that matter and life exist with Him as the creative and sustaining Source.
 - (2) Which is why a relationship with God is crucial to thinking Truth and understanding Reality. Pr.1:7
 - b) This is why evil is a broken relationship, not just a broken rule.
- C. The material world is very good and you should like it. 7 times he says it's good
 - 1. Normal Life is Holy!! Don't be a Gnostic.
 - a) It is not "more godly or spiritual" to reject physical life.
 - 2. He will re-create an even more excellent world. Rev.21-22
 - a) He is a gardener, a builder, an artist, a lover.
 - God likes material life enough to become a part of it permanently! Jn.1:1-5
- D. The Word of God is the Source of life and you should absorb it. He spoke ...
 - 1. The expression of His mind is source and sustenance of life materially and spiritually. Deut.8:3; Matt.4:4
 - 2. God communicates all the time to all of us. Rom.1:18-19. Ears to hear?
 - 3. Refusal to listen to Him and factor in His power is the root of all sorts of metaphysical error. Mark.12:24
- V. The Ultimate Word of God is a Person. Which is why we must come to the Word made Flesh in order to understand anything else in God's mind. Jn.1:1-5; 14-18.
 - 1. Jn.14:6. I Am the Way, Truth, Life.
