Introduction to Philippians: Acts 16

I. The grief and sorrow of the world is at times overwhelming. This is why Jesus said that in this world we would have tribulation. Jn.16:33. There is a book in the NT which points the way to joy, integrity, and Christian living. Philippians. Let's start with the birth of the church.

II. The birth of a great church. Acts 16

- A. Started by a missionary team (Paul usually traveled with a team).
 - 1. Founded in AD 50 on 2nd missionary journey. It's about 10 years old at this writing. (Maps)
 - a) **Paul**. about 50 years old, theologian, expositor, evangelist, apostle.
 - b) Silas. (Sylvanus).
 - (1) Roman citizen, probably a Hellenistic Jew,
 - (2) Influential member of the Jerusalem church, selected to go with Paul and Barnabas to Antioch after the Jerusalem council with the instructions for the Gentile converts.
 - (3) Chosen by Paul to replace Barnabas after Paul and Barny had a falling out over whether to take John Mark on the 2nd journey. No doubt a very sturdy character to go with Paul.
 - c) **Timothy**. "honoring God".
 - (1) Young man from Lystra (Galatia), the son of a Jewish woman and a Greek man, raised in the Jewish faith and taught to trust the Scripture and expect Messiah,
 - (2) Not circumcised until Paul drafted him into missionary work. Probably quite a bit younger than Paul, he was like a son to the apostle. Phil. 2:20
 - (3) He stayed to set the Ephesian church on track (I&II Timothy) when Paul went to Jerusalem, rejoined the apostle later and was on hand at the writing of Philippians.
 - d) **Luke.**
 - (1) Probably a Gentile (not mentioned among those of Jewish origin).
 - (2) Skilled writer and historian (Luke/ Acts = 30 % of material in NT, more than Paul or John! Luke wrote more of the NT than anybody.
- B. At an unlikely time: Following a time of some confusion. 6-10.
 - 1. The team had been turned away from two other "logical" fields.
 - a) Ever have a series of rejections before some clear direction?
 - 2. Guidance will come in time. Sometimes the waiting is excruciating, though.
 - a) But note that the normal way was just to try what seemed logical at the time. Asia, Bithynia.
- C. <u>In an unlikely way: a vision for help. 9</u>
 - 1. Unique in terms of guidance here. Normally guidance was a "common sense" or "providential" thing.
- D. In an unlikely place. a Roman military colony. 11-13
 - 1. A gathering (seemingly) outside, was there no synagogue?
 - 2. In a city that worshipped Caesar. Philippi was sort of a mini-Rome.
 - 3. A leading city, but not the capital, of Macedonia (Bulgaria).
 - 4. Located on the Via Ignatia (the Hwy. 5 of the day, on the way to Rome)
- E. Among an unlikely group of converts. 13 -15
 - 1. Started with a women's prayer group.
 - a) Lydia, first Christian in Europe, a "God-fearer" business woman.
 - 2. May have included an ex-demonized slave girl.
 - a) We don't know if she became a Christian, but it makes sense.
 - 3. Progressed with a Gentile Jailer and his household.
 - a) How would the others have responded to this?
- F. Amidst spiritual warfare. 16-18
 - 1. Pythian (python) spirit = spirit of divination.
 - 2. The girl was yelling, and drawing attention.
 - 3. Demons are there, but Paul doesn't deal with them right away.
 - 4. He only casts them out when they get in the way.
- G. In the heat of persecution. 19-34
 - 1. Profit motive behind the persecution.

III. How could the Philippian church come into being this way?

- A. Because the Spirit is at work before we are. 6,7
 - 1. Holy Spirit = Spirit of Jesus (only here)
 - 2. Guiding us to where the Lord wants us.
 - 3. Providentially and specifically guiding
- B. Bringing people under the power of the gospel through us. Rom.1:16-17
 - 1. The gospel is more powerful than we are.
 - 2. The Spirit (the Lord) opened her heart.
- C. In order to save the Lost from all walks of life. (Lk.19:10)
 - 1. Gentiles, Jews, Men, Women, Jailers, Slaves, Business people...

IV. Two thoughts on walking with the Lord in a fallen world.

A. A meaningful life is not found by avoiding adversity, but by pursuing God. (Phil.3:14)

- 1. You don't know what is going to happen next and you can't plan for every conceivable problem. Life is difficult anyway, adversity cannot be avoided
 - a) So, you might as well encounter your difficulties in the process of serving the Lord.

B. A meaningful ministry is not focused on itself, but on the gospel. I Cor. 2:1-5

- 1. We plant the gospel and nourish the gospel and the church grows around it. Personal testimony backed up by spiritual integrity is more powerful than media blitz or glossy covers.
 - a) Personal genuine passion for the Lord is better than polished, practiced acting.
- 2. Anybody can do this! You don't need special training, just an awareness of the real gospel.
