I. Philippians 3:1-16. Rejoice in the Lord...by staying in the gospel.

- A. Finally...Rejoice in the Lord... 1
 - 1. Repetition is no trouble (ask any preacher)
- B. Watch out for certain teachings. 2
 - 1. The dogs. Wild vicious animals, not pets.
 - a) Used of enemies of God. Jews used this term of Gentiles.
 - b) Paul turns it on the very people who used it of others.
 - 2. The evil workers. People doing evil work.
 - a) How could telling people to keep the Torah be considered "evil work." By teaching Christians that Torah obedience...
 - (1) Produces salvation. Rom.9:30-33
 - (2) Maintains salvation. Galatians
 - (3) Demonstrates salvation. Rom.2-5
 - 3. "The mutilation". (a new punk rock group?)
 - a) katatomane = cutters, people who cut
 - 4. **Who were these people? Judaizers**. Legalists from Judaism who came behind Paul and told people that they had to act Jewish in order to be Christian. **Acts 15:1**
 - 5. Paul calls them evil workers because heresy is evil work.
 - a) God will judge heresy. It's legal in our country, but that doesn't make it right. Gal. 1:6-9
 - b) Cults tell you to join their organization to be saved.

C. Because we (Christians) are the covenant people of God. 3 (Jn.1:12-13)

- 1. Note, He refers to the church as the circumcision—the covenant community of faith. Even though we are not under the law of circumcision! The New Covenant
 - a) Worship in the Spirit. (the messianic ministry)
 - (1) Latreuo = priestly service to YHWH
 - (2) The Holy Spirit as the agent of re-birth, loyalty, service and New Covenant worship
 - b) Glory in Christ Jesus. (Person and Work of Christ)
 - (1) Kauxaomai = boast/glory in: be confident and proud of someone or something for good reason. (Jer.9:23-24)
 - c) Put no confidence in the flesh.
 - (1) Confidence that by our personal strength we can contribute to the substance of our salvation.

D. And I know what I'm talking about. 4-11

- 1. My Religion was my life and main identity. 4-6
 - a) Circumcised the 8th day. Born into the Jewish community
 - b) Of the Nation of Israel, Of the tribe of Benjamin.
 - (1) A very proud tradition. Ben was the youngest and a favorite of Jacob. (King Saul was a Benjaminite, also Jeremiah)
 - c) Hebrew of the Hebrews = not a Hellenized Hebrew, but Hebrew speaking, steeped in the Law.
 - d) Pharisee. Dedicated to fanatical obedience to the Law.
 - e) Zeal. Persecutor of the church. Tried to kill the church.
 - f) Law-righteousness. Blameless?
 - (1) He had kept the law as far as Pharisaism was concerned.
 - g) Gal. 1:13-14 Note 3 characteristics of human, legalistic religion:
 - (1) Personal advancement is the goal. (Not Christlikeness)
 - (2) Competition is the means. (better than others) Jn. 5:44; II Cor. 10:12
 - (3) Zeal for human tradition is the stock-in-trade. Matt. 15:1-9
 - (a) Not the same as loving the Lord.

2. But losing everything to Jesus was the best thing that ever happened to me. 7-11

- a) Coming to know the Lord relativized all my other values.
- b) Rubbish = skubalon = earthy word for human excrement refuse, rubbish, garbage, dung.

3. Because the gift of His goodness (righteousness) has transformed me. 9-11

- a) <u>His Righteousness: His Gift to me.</u>
 - (1) Double Imputation. (Rom.3:20-5:1; 6:23)
 - (a) He takes our blame and gives us his record of goodness.
 - (2) The gift of a right relationship with God in Christ not dependent on law-obedience, but on radical faith in Jesus personally.
- b) His Relationship: Knowing Him. 10
 - (1) In the power of His resurrection
 - (2) Sharing of His suffering
 - (3) Anything to live in the resurrection 11.
 - (4) This is not doubt about his salvation, but humility with regard to his life.
- c) The Spirit deepens us and transforms us as we grow deeper in our appreciation of the gospel. The saving and transforming lordship of Jesus Christ.
- d) Look at the transformed desire in this man. This is an indicator of regeneration.

E. And I'm pressing forward in this grace. 12-16 (17)

1. Moving forward, deliberately interpreting life in light of the gospel. straining forward toward the upward call.

II. Remember that Joy is in the Lord (Rejoice in the Lord). This kind of joy becomes clearer when we...

A. Focus more on what we have gained in Christ than what we have lost in this world. 7-8

- 1. What I thought was gain... Lk.16:15
- 2. Loss in this age is inevitable. Gaining Christ changes our view of loss in this age. Knowing God in Christ relativizes all other things we know and experience.

A. Focus more on our relationship with Jesus than on how we have failed Him. 12-16 (1 Tim.1:15-17)

- 1. Paul was aware of his failings in the past, but the regret drove him deeper into Christ's grace.
- 2. Regret + Grace = wisdom and humility
- 3. Forgetting what lies behind = leaving the past under the blood.
 - a) Paul didn't really "forget" but he deliberately faced forward.
- 4. Effort? "Straining forward" is *not religious works*, but a heart attitude of wanting to be like the Lord and know Him more deeply.
 - a) Praying through hard times, grief and sorrow I want to be more like you, Lord.

A. Focus more on what he has done for us than on what we do for him. 3-9. 1]n.4:9-10

- 1. This will keep us out of moralistic, legalistic religion.
- 2. The mission is crucial and requires effort—but burnout is the result of not regularly coming back to the Cross and the arms of the Lord.
- 3. Back always to the Cross and the Propitiation (hilasmon)
- III. God's personal joy comes from living at the Cross, in His personal Word—the Message of who Jesus is and what He has done. The personal relationship with God in Christ.
