# Acts 13:13-52 (#21) 9.27.20 (20075) The Powerful Gospel

### I. Pisidian Antioch Outreach. Acts 13:13-52

- A. Phase two of the first missionary trip. 13
  - 1. Phase 1 is the mission mandate and the Cyprus outreach.
  - 2. Phase 2 is the Pisidian Antioch outreach.
  - 3. Phase 3 (next week) is the Derbe/Lystra
- B. John Mark goes home. (!) 13
- C. Sabbath synagogue meeting. Again, Paul is asked to speak...14-16

# II. Paul's Gospel. 16-43. Paul's Synagogue Sermon.

- A. God chose Israel. 17-22
  - 1. Patriarchs; Exodus; Desert; Canaan; Judges; Saul,
  - 2. David: Slowing down here. Dialogue "... a man after my own heart ..." coming to the point.
  - 3. God's hand seen in high-speed review, but life goes slowly when you're living it
- B. God brought the Savior through Israel. 23-25 (jumps 1000 years)
  - 1. Preceded by John B. (known to most Jewish people) Baptism of repentance, pointing away from himself to the Messiah.
- C. God predicted and planned the Cross and the Resurrection. 26-31 (Acts 2:23-24)
  - 1. Jerusalem Killed & Buried Him.
    - a) Unwittingly fulfilled prophetic Scripture
    - b) Implicit providence of God in all of this.
  - 2. God raised him from the dead. Permanently!
    - a) He appeared many times over a period of many days
  - 3. God had promised this all along. 32-37
    - a) Psalm 2:7. You are My Son, today I have begotten you. Incarnation.
    - b) Isaiah 55:3. I will give you the holy and sure blessings of David. Kingship
    - c) Psalm 16:10. You will not allow your Holy One to decompose. Resurrection.
- D. So, the two most important things you need come only through Jesus Christ: 38-39
  - 1. Forgiveness. What we need more than anything.Lk.24:
    - a) Repentant faith is more important than any human issue on offer.
  - 2. Freedom (justification). Our eternal record expunged. Rom.3:28; 8:1-2.
    - a) Freedom (justification) the Law could never provide.
    - b) Freedom (NAS) Justified (NIV) = dikaiow = acquitted, declared righteous, set free (like from prison after being declared innocent)
- E. So, don't scoff at God's message. 40-41
  - 1. Habakkuk 1:5 (late 7<sup>th</sup> cent BC.)
  - 2. This is a warning in Habakkuk is not about salvation happening, but judgment happening!
  - 3. God is doing something He's bringing judgment against the world. 17:31

### III. But the elites did scoff. In fact, they violently rejected the message. 44-52

- A. Large numbers of people came to the Lord. 44
- B. Which threw the balance of power into a tail-spin. 45
  - 1. They realized that the gospel is a threat to pagan and religious influence.
- C. So, the elites pressure the messengers out. 50
- D. But this does not stop the gospel itself. 46-48, 51-52

## IV. The gospel is the best news ever proclaimed to humanity.

- A. God loves sinful humans and has singlehandedly defeated evil and death on their behalf, offering us real, eternal life. WOW!
  - 1. He will eternally forgive us of all our sins. Rom.8:1-2
    - a) Freed from what the Law could not heal
  - 2. He will permanently declare us righteous (justification). Rom.3:28
    - a) Beyond bare forgiveness, declared positively good.
  - 3. He will guarantee our physical resurrection. Phil.3:20
    - a) Christ's resurrection is the victory and we share it by coming into Him through the Spirit by faith.
  - 4. He will recreate the world without evil and death. Rev.21-22
    - a) Evil and death will end and life will take on what we have always sensed intuitively should happen. (Rev.21-22)

### B. So...what is not to like about this?

1. Well, as it turns out, among fallen humanity there is quite a bit not to like...

## V. Consider the implications of Jesus as the Risen Lord:

- A. If Jesus is the risen Lord, then religion is over. Acts 13:38-39
  - 1. Judaism is over (Rom.10:4)
    - a) Nobody is "grandfathered" in through race or tradition.
  - 2. And if Judaism (God's Torah Tradition) can't save us, no religious tradition of human origin can.
  - 3. But we like our religions! Note it was "devout and influential" women and men that threw Paul out of town.
- B. If Jesus is the risen Lord, then all other "gods" are false. Jn.14:6
  - 1. The Roman and Greek pagan religions were idolatries. 1 Cor.10:20
  - 2. Humans have worshipped almost everything but God.
    - a) Sun, moon, stars, animals, insects, mythological deities.
    - b) Hinduism has thousands of gods and traditions.
    - c) All the "spiritualities" that focus on the Self are wrong.
    - d) Self-enlightenment, etc.
  - 3. But we like our idolatries!
- C. If Jesus is the risen Lord, then atheist philosophy is wrong.
  - 1. There is only one God and he is a Person, not a principle.
  - 2. Specifically naturalism in the west
    - a) The forces of physics are not eternal—they are the active expression of God's mind, his law regarding energy and matter.
    - b) There is eternal life, life after death—and death after life! (2<sup>nd</sup> death, Rev.20:6, 14)
  - 3. But we like our philosophies! They let us discuss life without reference to God.
- D. <u>If Jesus is the risen Lord, then there will be a judgment and our goodness cannot save us—only He can.</u> <u>Acts 13:40-41. Hab.1:5 (Isa.64:6)</u>
  - 1. But we like the idea that there won't be a judgment.
  - 2. And we like the idea that if there is a judgment, our own goodness will suffice!

VI. So, coming into Christ is truly a break with the past (repentance) and an embracing of a new identity and destiny in Christ alone (faith). Do you want this? Rom.10:9-10
