Focus

In a chaotic world filled with competing voices and pressures, the difficult thing is to remain focused.

One of the supreme virtues of walking with the Lord is a sense of focus in life. Jesus taught his friends about this.

Luke 10:41-42.

Paul demonstrates great focus in Acts 20 ...

I. Background

- A. Third Missionary Journey, Early Spring, probably around 58 AD
- B. Paul is on his way to Jerusalem (hopefully by Pentecost in late May)
 - 1. Just finished 4 years of fruitful ministry in Ephesus, then Macedonia and Achaia (Corinth for the Winter).
 - 2. Just wrote Romans (in Corinth)
 - 3. He's traveling with a group of men representatives from the churches of Macedonia.
 - 4. He's got a large offering, collected from the Gentile churches for the famished Christians at Jerusalem.
 - 5. He has not stopped in Ephesus, because he wants to get to Jerusalem by Pentecost (late May).
- C. He has called the Elders from Miletus... 36 miles S. of Ephesus.

II. Paul's last talk with his Ephesian leaders. Acts 20:17-38

- A. I lived among you, serving the Lord. 17-21
 - 1. By staying through the stress. 19
 - a) Humility, tears and trials through the plots of the Jews.
 - b) Note the stress of representing the gospel in a pagan culture.
 - 2. By communicating what is spiritually profitable: the implications and applications of the gospel. 20-21
 - a) Declaring, Teaching, Testifying to everybody who would listen.
 - b) Communicating the gospel and its wisdom.
 - (1) Repentance toward God.
 - (a) Turning from evil at every level.
 - (2) Faith in our Lord, Jesus Christ.
 - (a) Jesus is the Messiah who saves us by sheer grace. Full person and work of Jesus Christ
 - c) The whole counsel of God. 27
 - 3. Note the importance of teaching, thinking and responding practically (35)
- B. Now I'm going to Jerusalem. 22-24
 - 1. The Spirit is compelling me forward, to Jerusalem.
 - a) And I don't know exactly what will happen...
 - b) Except I know it will be hard...
 - 2. My personal life is not the most important thing to me. 24
 - a) Finishing my course is...
 - 3. The gospel of the grace of God is more important than I am.
 - a) I must bear witness of it.
 - 4. I won't see you again. 25
- C. So, keep your head in the game (elders, pastors). 25-30
 - 1. Pay close attention to yourselves and the flock
 - 2. God bought these sheep with his own blood! 28
 - 3. Watch out for false leaders and twisted teachings. Rom.16:17-18

D. And follow my example. 31-35

- 1. I offered admonition all the time. 31
 - a) Noutheto = from "nous" mind, put into someone's mind = warn, instruct, teach, correct, keeping people on the right track.
 - b) With tears = seriously
- 2. I focused you on God and His Word. 32
 - a) The gospel, able to build you up.
- 3. I wasn't after your money or your stuff. 33-34
- 4. I showed that ministry is hard work on behalf of the weak. 35
- 5. This is thinking like Jesus. *It is more blessed to give than to receive.*

E. Let's pray together one more time. 36-38

1. Radically committed to the importance of prayer and love toward each other.

III. Four Questions that help us focus in a fallen world.

A. Why would Paul be tempted to "shrink from" giving what is profitable (for faith). 19-21

- 1. Because repentance toward God and faith in Jesus the Messiah are profoundly controversial.
 - a) The incarnation, atonement, resurrection, ascension. If these things are true, humanity is utterly lost.
- 2. Because what is profitable for walking with God in Christ is a threat to all idolatry (religions and philosophies that are grounded in paganism/atheism). If the gospel is true, the other religions and philosophies are not. People do not want to know this.

B. Why would Paul say that he was "innocent of the blood of all of them?" 26

- 1. Because the gospel is a life-or-death issue. Blood? Matt.10:28
 - a) Heaven and hell are real. Judgment is real. Even forgiven Christians will stand before the Lord. 2 Cor.5:10
- 2. Because having communicated it to the best of his ability, his job was essentially done.
 - a) It is not our job to actually regenerate people. The Lord does that through the gospel (Rom.1:16-17).
 - b) Our job is to pray and communicate the true gospel to people.

C. How could Paul leave these people in danger, confidently? 32

- 1. He trusted God with them.
 - a) Can we trust God with all the 7 billion human souls on earth? How about our loved ones?
- 2. He trusted the gospel in them.
 - a) The Word of His Grace = the whole message of the gospel, ever more deeply understood.
 - (1) Read Romans and the Pauline epistles
 - b) Build you up. Greek = construct, like building a house.
 - (1) Give you the inheritance among those sanctified (set apart to God)
 - c) Continued understanding of this gospel word from God strengthens our minds.
 - d) The whole Bible as it points to Christ.
- 3. Which is why when we gather, the topic is God, Christ, the gospel and how to live in a fallen world with a risen mindset (Col.3:1-4).
 - a) Because we need to be built up in our knowledge of God.

D. Why would Paul feel constrained by the Spirit to risk going to Jerusalem? 22-24

- 1. Because he had a purpose in life that transcends this life—God, and the gospel of His Grace.
 - a) Running his course for the Lord, not counting his earthly life as the most important thing. This is almost the opposite of our current postmodern view of life. But it is what gave an eternal and Real focus to Paul, taught to him by Jesus.

IV. We simply must have a purpose for life that transcends death.

- A. God's grace is what we need more than a new society...
- B. Because God's kingdom is the only eternal kingdom (Isa.9:6-7)
- C. And God's Son is the only way into that reality. Jn.14:6
